





Test-Taking Strategies

<p style="text-align: center;">Check It Out</p>  <p>When you have completed a test, go back and CHECK IT OUT one more time. Sit back and relax as you browse through the test to reaffirm your answers. Go the extra mile, and you'll be a winner!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">“Jail” the Detail</p>  <p>Highlight, <u>underline</u>, or <u>circle</u> the details in the questions. This will help you focus on exactly what the question is asking.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Plug It In, Plug It In</p>  <p>Once you have chosen your answer, PLUG IT IN and make sure it makes sense. Example: $100 - x = 60$ A. 30 B. 40 C. 50 The correct answer is B. PLUG IT IN! $100 - 40 = 60$ It works, so your choice is obviously correct.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Slash the Trash</p>  <p>Read all of the answer choices. Eliminate any choices that you know are wrong—those choices are obviously trash. SLASH THE TRASH! Think carefully over the choices remaining. Select what you think is the best answer.</p>
